- Chat with people in your network who've worked in public service.
- Catch up on local news or City projects—you might surprise us with your knowledge!

The more you know, the more confident you'll feel walking into that room.

## **£** Facing the Panel

Yes, a panel interview can feel intimidating—you're talking to multiple people at once. But remember, the panel isn't there to scare you; they're there to see how you interact with different team members. Here's how to approach it:

- Greet everyone when you walk in (even if it feels a little awkward).
- When answering, make eye contact with the whole panel—not just the person who asked the question.
- Keep answers structured and clear. Pro tip: use the STAR method (Situation, Task, Action, Result). It keeps your stories short, powerful, and easy to follow.
- Show personality! We're hiring people, not robots.



# Interview Day Tips

When the big day comes, remember the basics:

- Arrive on time and put your best foot forward (literally—polished shoes and all!).
- Dress professionally, and pay attention to the details.
- Bring extra copies of your résumé and something to write with.
- Relax! Your comfort with the team matters just as much as your answers.
