1. Retirement of Military Banners Presentation by the Tri-State Military Moms, Inc.

Mayor D’Amico presented “Welcome Home” certificates to the retiring military members. Members of the Tri-State Military Moms read the biographies of each member and the retired highway banners were presented.

**OPEN CALL TO THE PUBLIC**

Mayor D’Amico opened the call to the public.

Chris Morgan from the Bullhead Regional Foodbank said they won the ACC Award for small business/non-profit. He thanked the Council for their support, and said construction for the new building will begin on the first or second week in December. He said they hope to have the project completed in February 2025.

Teri Tomlinson said they are poised to serve approximately 500 Thanksgiving and Christmas meals. She thanked the Legacy Foundation, the River Fund, DOT Foods, and St. Mary's for their support. She said they received a grant to hire an executive director, and said this will allow them to serve more food and have a greater choice of foods to serve. Pastor Steven Brown thanked the Council, volunteers, Charles Gill, and Hildy Angius for everything they have done for the foodbank.

Barbara Pape provided information on the upcoming Colorado River Women's Republican luncheon to be held at the Chaparral Country Club.

Susana Van Sloten provided information on the Colorado River Museum and Historical Society Honey Baked Ham fundraiser. She said the funds raised will benefit the Colorado River Museum.

Rose Jacobs gave information on the upcoming Colorado River Concert Association season.

Linda Saldana said she is representing Veterans United. She said on November 11th they are going to do an unveiling of the military K9 monument. She said they still need volunteers and sponsors for the upcoming live nativity event.

Michael Palacio said he is representing the Bullhead City Community Garden. He thanked Mohave Electric for donating 25 trees, and thanked Bullhead City, Hildy Angius, Redmond Construction, Aquatic Landscape, and Eagle Fence for helping to put this project together.

Ivy Yoemans said the Alcohol Anonymous meeting location has been moved to 2410 Miracle Mile, Suite B. She said the meetings will be held at 7:00 a.m., 12:00 p.m., and 6:00 p.m.

Sean Regan said 5 officers from the Bullhead City Police Department removed a homeless veteran and his things from the area. He said the veteran was staying on private property, and said his information was ran illegally. He said the homeless shelter is insufficient because it lacks dignity, space, and availability.

Harvey Pryor said there was a waterline repair done approximately 6 weeks ago on Alta Vista Drive and Alta Vista Lane. He said the hole was filled with gravel, and said the road needed to be properly repaired. He said the streets need to be swept on the east side of Highway 95 and Ramar, and said he would like an update on the high speed chase that took place through Bullhead City a few weeks ago.

Scotty McClure said a water main was hit on Santa Cruz Avenue and the street is full of mud. He said he was upset that the Mohave County Board of Supervisors voted in favor of building a power plant in Mohave Valley.

Captain John Birks from the Salvation Army said the kettle kick-off will take place on November 23rd at the Bullhead Area Chamber of Commerce, and said a silent auction will take place during the event.

Having no one else present requesting to speak, Mayor D'Amico closed the call to the public.

**MANAGER'S REPORT**

1. Election Day Final Information

City Manager Cotter gave election information. He said the polls are open until 7:00 p.m. and said additional information can be found on the elections page of the Mohave County website. He said the newly elected Bullhead City Council Members will be sworn-in during the November 19th Council Meeting.

2. Space Force Flags

City Manager Cotter said Vice Mayor Alfonzo brought it to his attention that the city is not appropriately displaying the Space Force flags at the peninsula. He said he is working with staff to make sure all military division flags are correctly displayed.

3. Transit Closed for Thanksgiving Holiday

City Manager Cotter said he wanted to remind the public that there will be no bus service November 28th through December 1st.

City Manager Cotter said he wanted to address the criticism that was given tonight during open call the public regarding camping. He said it is illegal to camp in the city outside of a designated campground such as Davis Camp, and said it is illegal to trespass. He said the individuals arrested today for camping within the city limits were trespassing, and said the gentleman who was arrested was trespassing. He said his dog and his wife were treated with respect and dignity, and all their property was secured and taken to the police station, and he and his wife took it with them when they were released. He said the gentleman was also offered resources. He said everyday employees are out in the community working with our social service agencies such as River Fund, Catholic Charities and many others trying to assist people who are homeless or near homeless. He said it is a huge priority of the city to treat people with compassion, and said it is also a huge priority of the city to enforce our no camping ordinance. He said people who continue to camp and trespass will be arrested.

Council Member Lizarraga wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

She said there is a fireside rhythm and drum circle benefiting Meals on Wheels on November 18th at 5:00 p.m. at the fire pit at Don Sullivan Park.

Council Member Lettman said he will not be able to attend the next council meeting due to an upcoming family event. He congratulated Newly Elected Council Members Jason Newlin, Karen Dallman, and Gene O'Neill. He said they are prepped for success, and said they are going to do a great job. He said he has been on council for 15 months and said it has been a real learning experience. He thanked city staff for all they do, and said they do a really great job. He said he hoped Council Member Tami Ring, Vice Mayor Dan Alfonzo, and Mayor D'Amico run for re-election, and said they will have his full support.

Council Member Head said he will be on a planned vacation during the next council meeting, and said he will attend the next meeting via telephone. He thanked Council Members Rich Lettman, Grace Hecht, and Juan Lizarraga for all their help and everything they have done while serving on the Council. 4. Discussion and possible action to approve an Amendment to Amended and Restated Integrated License Agreement between the City of Bullhead City and Allied Waste Transportation, Inc. DBA Republic Services of the Colorado River Valley for the Collection, Transportation and Disposal of Solid Waste, and authorize the City Manager to execute the amendment and take all appropriate actions consistent with its implementation. (City Manager Cotter)

City Manager Cotter said the city has used Republic Services and their former owners for several decades and said it has worked very well. He said costs are relatively low compared to most cities in Arizona. He said this item is adding another five years to the Agreement, and said recycling was not added. He said there is language that allows future councils to address recycling within that five-year period. He said if recycling becomes worth doing and is not a huge expense to the consumer, it will be capped at no more than 5 percent per year, but there is a floor of 2 percent. He said minor edits were made to some of the parks and city facilities that are currently being served, and said Gary Keith Park and the animal shelter were added.

Mayor D'Amico asked if anyone from the public wanted to speak on this item.

Jason Newlin said this item was on the last Franchise License Commission agenda, but no update was given. He said he looked through the past few years of his Republic Services bills to verify the

increase schedule, and said the clarification of language is acceptable. He said he recommends approval of this item as a Franchise License Commission Member.

**Council Member Lettman made a motion to approve an Amendment to Amended and Restated Integrated License Agreement between the City of Bullhead City and Allied Waste Transportation, Inc. DBA Republic Services of the Colorado River Valley for the Collection, Transportation and Disposal of Solid Waste, and authorize the City Manager to execute the amendment and take all appropriate actions consistent with its implementation. Discussion and possible action to approve the "Amendment to Gary Keith Civic Park Improvements Community Pride Advocates Grant Agreement Phase III Ramada/Pavilion Construction" in the additional amount of \$315,587.00 and authorize the City Manager to execute the amendment and take all actions consistent with the implementation of the agreement; and further, upon final approval of the improvements by staff, the project is deemed to be accepted for City ownership and maintenance for the benefit of the public. (City Manager Cotter)

City Manager Cotter said this is the final action of the Gary Keith Park project. He said he included 355 pages in this packet so the Council and the public could see all the work and energy that has gone into the new park. He said they have been working with Community Pride Advocates. He said in building the new pavilion, they have gone through some twists and turns in the economy, inflation, and rising prices in steel and concrete. He said included in the council packet is all the information that was provided by the Community Pride Advocates. He said the additional \$315,000 finishes the project, and said \$80,000 will pay for the landscaping and related components. He said he and Mayor D'Amico toured the site and said they were satisfied with the project.

Vice Mayor Alfonzo asked if the land is owned by the city or BLM (Bureau of Land Management). City Manager Cotter said the land is owned by BLM, and said the city has a park and recreation lease on the land.

Council Member Hecht asked how much revenue Gary Keith Park will contribute to the city. City Manager Cotter said they anticipate at least \$25,000 a year in revenue. Council Member Hecht said the park is a wonderful addition to the city.

Council Member Head congratulated everyone that was involved with the project.

Mayor D'Amico said he hoped the White Night in the Park event would continue.

Mayor D'Amico asked if anyone from the public wanted to speak on this item.

Scotty McClure said traffic improvements need to be made at Gary Keith Park during special events.

Olivia McCormick said Community Pride is committed to ongoing fundraising and improvements. She said their mission now is to enhance cultural and performing arts facility processes. She said they will continue with the White Night event. She said this project was built by the community for the community, and said they are excited to turn it over to the city for future use and enjoyment.

6. Discussion and possible action to approve the proposal submitted by Tank Maintenance Solutions for the repair of the water storage tank at Site 3 in an amount not to exceed \$142,558.00 plus applicable taxes and bonding, and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement and issue resultant payments; and further, pursuant to Bullhead City Municipal Code Section 3.37.030 (D), competitive bidding is waived as being in the best interest of the City. (Utilities Director Clark)

Utilities Director Clark said this tank helps serve the northern part of the city, primarily the Sun Ridge, Punto de Vista, and Desert Canyon area. He said a few months ago the tank had a leak and they were afraid they would lose the whole bottom of the tank. He said they asked the company that has been performing tank inspections for the city to come out and do an inspection of the tank. He said they inspected the tank and did a temporary repair. He said they thought the tank was okay after the repair, but the tank started leaking again because the break on the bottom of the tank started migrating. He said the break moved outside of the repaired area and started leaking again. He said the same company that did the repair came back and looked at the tank. He said he was informed that the bottom of the tank had washed out and the tank floor was becoming mushy; meaning they could lose the tank at any time. He said they asked the company to submit a proposal since they were already on site, and they already knew what the problem was. He said now they must empty the tank, cut out a piece of the tank floor, redo the subbase, and weld a new floor in the bottom of the tank. He said they do not know exactly how much work it is going to take until they start taking the floor out. He said depending on how bad it is, he may have to come back to the Council for a supplemental approval. He said they do believe that with the information they currently have, this will be enough to do the final repair for the tank.

Vice Mayor Alfonzo asked what types of warranties there are for materials and labor. Utilities Director Clark said there is usually a 1-year labor and materials warranty.

Council Member Head asked how much it would cost to replace the tank. Utilities Director Clark said they are currently using a welded steel tank. He said there are different types of tanks, and said in the future they will start using stressed concrete tanks. He said the stressed concrete tanks are better and they last longer. He said the costs of the tanks have gone down so it is now more

economical to build smaller tanks with stressed concrete. He said the cost of replacing the current tank will cost just under \$1 million.

Mayor D'Amico asked if anyone from the public wanted to speak on this item.

Harvey Pryor asked if there were pictures of the damaged tank. He said he looked in the packet and could not find any. Utilities Director Clark said there are pictures, and said he will include pictures with the next presentation.

Shawn Regan asked if this item was budgeted. Utilities Director Clark said this was an emergency repair and therefore not in the budget.

Discussion and possible action to approve the "Agreement for Removal and Installation of a New Pump and Motor for Well 9" with Layne Christianson in the amount of \$120,008.98 plus applicable taxes, and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement and issue resultant payments; and further, pursuant to Bullhead City Municipal Code Section 3.37.030(D), competitive bidding is waived as being in the best interest of the City. (Utilities Director Clark)

Utilities Director Clark said this item is to replace the pump, motor, and new wiring for Well 9. He said they are installing new wiring because the current wire has a large gouge in it and is no longer usable. He said one of the problems they had was that the column pipe was crusted so hard they could not untwist it, so they had to cut the column pipe out. He said they are running water trucks 24/7 so people will have water, and said they need to get the well back in service as soon as possible. He said this is one of the two largest wells serving the area.

Mayor D'Amico asked if anyone from the public wanted to speak on this item.

Harvey Pryor asked Utilities Director Clark if there are any photos to go along with this item. Utilities Director Clark said they do have photos, and he will present them at a future council meeting. Harvey Pryor asked if this will be the final cost of the project, or will additional funds be needed later. Utilities Director Clark said they will have to bring the column pipe to council because they were not planning on replacing it when the agreement was made.

**Council Member Lizarraga made a motion to approve the “Agreement for Removal and Installation of a New Pump and Motor for Well 9” with Layne Christianson in the amount of \$120,008.98 plus applicable taxes, and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement and issue resultant payments; and further, pursuant to Bullhead City Municipal Code Section 3.37.030(D), competitive bidding is waived as being in the best interest of the City. Assistant City Manager Kajirwa said this item is a matter of formality. He said the city was awarded a grant in the amount of \$100,000 to be used towards the community garden, and said this item is the formal authorization to enter into an agreement to authorize the funds.

Mayor D’Amico asked if anyone from the public wanted to speak on this item.

Shawn Regan asked if the city would track how the funds are spent. Assistant City Manager Kajirwa said there is a breakdown on what the funds will be used for.

**Council Member Ring made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2024R-53, approving a Funding Agreement with Mohave County for the receipt of ARPA funds in the amount of \$100,000 to be used towards the development of a community garden adjacent to Ken Fovargue Park. 10. Discussion and possible action to adopt ORDINANCE NO. 2024-30, by reference, approving an amendment to Title 12, Section 12.12.043, Dogs – Not allowed, of the Bullhead City municipal code; and adopting RESOLUTION NO. 2024R-54 declaring the code amendment a public record. (Recreation Superintendent Heath)

City Manager Cotter said this item is a prohibition that is already in the current code about dogs on sports fields. He said as the city continues to grow its sports, sports venues, and tournaments; more people come to the community with their dogs. He said there is plenty of space within the parks to accommodate the growing number of dogs, but when they collide with sports and sports tournaments, it becomes a problem. He said this item provides additional clarity and provides definition and designation for boundaries. He said this discussion came up many years ago during a regular youth soccer game. He said he believed there were approximately 9 reported dog bites on the soccer fields. He said the Council took action and adopted an ordinance stating that dogs are not allowed on the fields where kids are playing and moved the dogs away from the sports fields. He said they still have people coming to those events and said staff are confronted with it every time there is an event or activity. He said this amendment will provide extra clarity as to where dogs are allowed during events.

Mayor D'Amico asked if pickleball and tennis courts would also be included. City Manager Cotter answered affirmative.

Council Member Hecht asked who would enforce the code amendment. Recreation Superintendent Heath said the park rangers usually inform the pet owner that their pet is not allowed to be on the field. He said if the person refuses to remove their pet, the police department will be called. Council Member Hecht asked if service animals will still be allowed on the fields. Recreation Superintendent Heath answered affirmative.

Mayor D'Amico asked if anyone from the public wanted to speak on this item.

Scotty McClure said he often sees dog owners playing frisbee with their dogs on the fields. He said he was in favor of this item because it will stop people from allowing their dogs to run around without a leash and making a mess of the fields.

Shawn Regan said one of the problems is that anyone can purchase vests and patches that say "service dog" and declare their dog a service dog. He said someone who has a service dog can be asked to leave if their dog is not behaving properly.

Assistant City Manager Kajirwa said this item came before the Council on September 17, 2024. He said the Council approved the agreement with Kay Constructors to do the aeration basin station. He said approval of this item will allow staff to submit the loan application to the Greater Arizona Development Authority. He said GADA was reactivated with the focus being to help finance local government with infrastructure projects.

Vice Mayor Alfonzo said the application states it is due by October 1st and today is November 5th, and asked if the application has been submitted yet. Assistant City Manager Kajirwa said the application was submitted on October 1st and said GADA is allowing cities to submit council and board resolutions until December 1st.

Mayor D’Amico asked if anyone from the public wanted to speak on this item. No one spoke.

**Council Member Ring made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2024R-55, ratifying the submission of the GADA loan application in the amount of \$8,938,046.91 plus financing fees/interest, approve the receipt of funds and authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute any loan documents as may be required.
